The bird of paradise plants grow slow and form clumps of large banana-type leaves. When propagated from seed, it takes four to seven years for the bird of paradise to bloom. To speed up bird of paradise propagation, propagate plants through plant division every two or three years. Humid subtropical climates are usually found on the east coasts of continents like the southeast of the United States, the southeast of South America and South Africa, and the eastern area of Australia.

5. Establish a canopy. Use tough plants to establish a tallish canopy, under which you can grow all your tropical plants.
